Sanger is Awarded Film Friendly Community Designation

On January 29, 2016, the Texas Film Commission awarded Sanger the Film Friendly Community designation. The Film Friendly Texas (FFTX) program provides training and ongoing guidance to statewide community representatives on how to effectively market their communities as filming destinations and how to efficiently accommodate on-location filming activity.

To qualify for this designation, cities have to attend a Film Friendly Texas training workshop, submit photo coverage of potential filming locations for inclusion in the Texas Film Commission location database and pass filming guidelines. "Obtaining this designation is another program that validates Sanger's commitment to economic development opportunities within the community," said Parks and Recreation Director Jim Berman.
